Once South Central Los Angeles Regional Center (SCLARC) determines a person is eligible for services, our staff members form partnerships with our consumers and families in order to select the necessary services and programs. The amount and level of services depend upon an individual's personal needs. Our Regional Center's Service Coordinators also assist consumers in obtaining services from other agencies.

# Developmental Disabilities

A developmental disability is defined as:

- Intellectual Disability
- Cerebral Palsy
- Epilepsy
- Autism
- A disabling condition closely related to, or requiring treatment similar to, intellectual disability.

Any person residing within our Regional Center service area, and who is believed to have or be at risk of having a developmental disability, may receive an assessment free of charge.



# Eligibility for Services

To be eligible for regional center services, a person must meet **three conditions:**

1. The disability must start before the age of 18
2. The disability must be likely to continue indefinitely.
3. The disability must be a substantial handicap.

Individuals are not eligible for regional center services if they have a condition that is solely a mental health disorder, solely a learning disability, or solely physical in nature.

# Application & Referral for Services

Any person may call SCLARC and talk to an Intake Assistant to discuss an application or referral. Referrals may be made by anyone concerned about a person they believe could benefit from regional center services. Applications can be made by parents, guardians, conservators or self-referred individuals.

**SCLARC obtains services based on an individual's need. Programs you may be eligible for include:**

- Infant Development Programs
- Adult Day Programs
- Residential Placement
- Independent Living Skills Training
- Independent/Supported Living
- Employment Programs
